1. How is the Lord pictured in verse 1? What is the “train of His robe”?
2. The word seraphim (v. 2) means “burning one”. Why is that appropriate for these angelic beings? How often are the mentioned in Scripture? Why do you suppose they have their wings covering their face and feet?
3. Why do the angels repeat “holy” three times (v. 3)? In what sense is the whole earth full of His glory?
4. Why is the foundation trembling in verse 4? Why do you suppose the temple is filling with smoke?
5. Why is Isaiah distressed in verse 5? Why the emphasis on “unclean lips”? What host is the King Lord of? How should we share Isaiah’s attitude?
6. How does the seraphim’s action in verses 6-7 take Isaiah’s iniquity away? Doesn’t there have to be death to pay for sin (Romans 6:23)?
7. Does the Lord’s question in verse 8 indicate He is confounded? In what sense is He still looking for people to send? Can you join in Isaiah’s enthusiastic response?
8. Why did the Lord want Isaiah to tell the people to listen without understanding with dull ears and dim eyes (v. 9-10)? Doesn’t He want the people to return and be healed?
9. How long was Isaiah to proclaim this message (v. 11-12)? When would that occur?
10. What glimmer of hope is given in verse 13? What does the “tenth” and the “stump” represent? What suffering will they still endure? What does the “holy seed” represent?
