6. How can you intentionally grow in being a woman who *teaching what is good* through example?
7. Read James 1:22-25. Are there areas where you’ve been hearing but not doing? What would stepping up look like?

8. Do you identify with the attitude or season Mrs. Joy Brown was in (pp. 69-70)?
- If so, what practical steps can you take to surrender that mindset to God?
9. If you feel ready to disciple but don't yet have someone:
- How can you continue growing, serving, and preparing in the meantime?
 - What will help you remain encouraged and available instead of discouraged or passive?
